*Description:* The cold snap, during the winter of 2017, affected the entire region and its customers. An estimated two million barrels of oil were burned in order to produce enough electricity for New England alone. The potential use of more fossil fuels during peak times will directly affect the region's GHG emission's goals for 2020. States and provinces have turned to energy storage as a potential solution in order to deliver reliable clean energy to the consumers without tapping into fossil fuel sources. With technology advancing at a rapid pace and energy storage being at the forefront of conversation, what does the future of energy distribution look like and how will this affect energy supply for the region?
