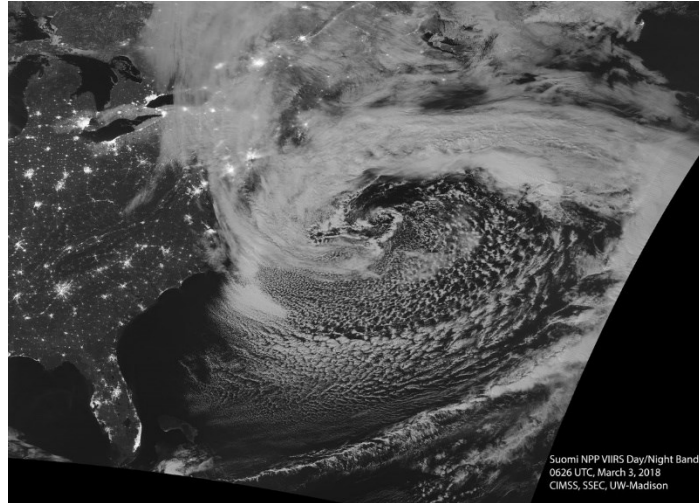


Second Hundred Year Storm of 2018 Wallops the Northeast

For the second time in two months a hundred year storm, another bomb cyclone, swept across the Northeast with furious rage.

Governors declared states of emergency from Virginia to Massachusetts, as gale force winds, coastal flooding, and intense snowfall blanketed the region. Two million people lost power; two thousand flight cancellations; Boston Harbor's water level was 3rd highest in history, and Syracuse University canceled classes for only the second time ever.



According to the Weather Channel, four different locations in Massachusetts reported winds gusts of 90 mph or more, including Barnstable (93 mph), East Falmouth (92 mph), Wellfleet (91 mph) and Nantucket (90 mph).

Wind gusts of 80 mph or greater were clocked in Scituate, Massachusetts, and at Little Compton, Rhode Island (83 mph).

Some areas of New York picked up as much as 40 inches of snow.
